The Sino-German College of Applied Sciences at Tongji University (CDHAW) has been founded in 2004 as a pilot project of China's Ministry of Education (MoE) and Germany's Federal Ministry of Education and Research (BMBF).

Partners of the CDHAW are Tongji University and the German University Consortium for International Cooperations (DHIK).

The college is funded by the Tongji with funds of the Chinese MoE and the German Academic Exchange Service (DAAD) by funds of the BMBF.

The main objective is to implement a practice-oriented engineering education in China according to the German model of Universities of Applied Sciences.

The CDHAW has been highlighted as a lighthouse project of academic cooperation between both countries and Prof. Orth, Overall Coordinator China DHIK, received the Federal Cross of Merit (Bundesverdienstkreuz) 1st class for his work.

Strategic Objectives

- Integration of essential elements of the German practice-oriented engineering education in China in close cooperation with the industry
- Increase of the quality of engineering education
- Acquisition of cross-cultural competencies for German and Chinese students
- Increase of Sino-German cooperation in the area of academic education

Tongji University

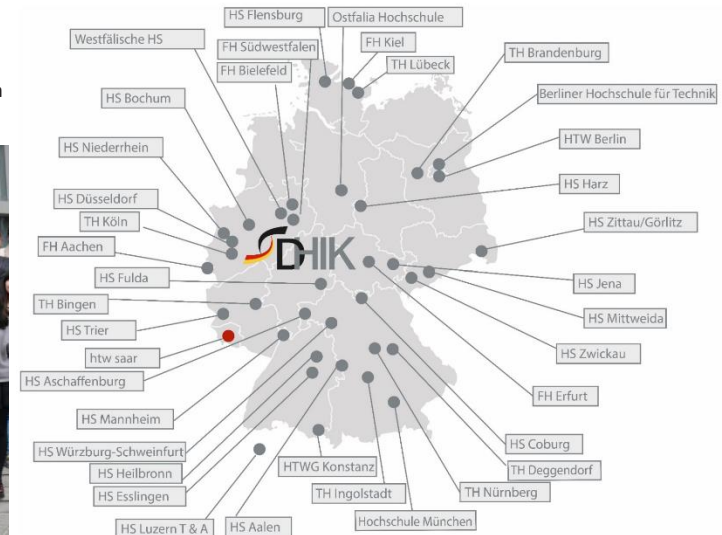
Tongji University is one of the most renowned universities in China, famous especially for the departments of engineering sciences, economics, and architecture/city planning. Since its founding in 1907 by the German physician Erich Paulun Tongji University has maintained strong academic cooperation with Germany and is considered China's gateway to Germany. The Sino-German College (Chinesisch-Deutsche Hochschule, CDH) is a joint platform for all Tongji institutions with a German focus.
